Stewardship Reflections November 10, 2024 –

32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time Today's First Reading from the First Book of Kings, as well as the Gospel passages from Mark, both center on the actions of two poor widows. The Gospel passage is often called the story of the: Widow's Mite." But taken together, perhaps a more fitting title of the stories of these two ladies would be, "The Mighty Widows."

In the First Reading, the prophet Elijah encounters a widow and her son during a terrible famine. In the Gospel, Jesus observes a poor widow contributing all she had as an offering. Both women

found themselves in desperate situations, yet each demonstrated strength and generosity that distinguished them from those around them.

These women saw themselves as stewards, not owners, of the recourses God gave them, regardless of how much or how little they had. And acting as stewards made them gracious, generous and mighty indeed.
